### Australia Hosts International Biotechnology Showcase: **Ausbiotech 2009**

Monday 3rd August 2009 - Australia's national body for the biotechnology and life sciences industry, AusBiotech, has announced AusBiotech 2009 - the premier Australasian biotechnology conference. The conference is expected to attract more than 1,400 delegates, including a large number of international delegates.

Australia's biotechnology sector has matured into an internationally recognised industry, ranking sixth in the world in innovative biotechnologies. AusBiotech 2009 will bring together the who's who of biotechnology from Australia and around the world in one world-class event.

AusBiotech 2009 will be preceded by the inaugural AusBiotech Australasian Life Sciences Investment Summit, an invitation-only, one-day event designed specifically to demonstrate to investors the high calibre of investment potential in Australia's biotechnology industry.
